

Last week 78 people saw Donovan Bixley, Kat Merewether, James Russell and Angela Keoghan with chair Nicola Daly at the New Zealand Children's Book Illustration and Design Panel at Wintec's Long Room. We heard about being inspired by what you hate (to create better stories), the challenges and extra tasks with being self-published, how each panellist's world view shapes their work and what they are currently working on.



About 70 people were at The Lido yesterday to hear local authors whose books included poetry, politics, local history, family history, children's stories, self-help, fiction and project management. We heard about the decisions made on their publishing journeys including whether to try conventional publishing houses or to self-publish, how to format their work, what to do about illustrations, whether to do a sequel, how to market their work and so on. After MC Cate Prestidge had thanked our authors, they had further discussions with interested buyers and sold their books.


Fiction Writing Workshop
